

What does my child learning during their time at Sutton CE?

At Sutton CE, as we have 'mixed-age classes' we work on a two year rolling programme of learning. This ensures we cover the full national curriculum and do not repeat learning. If you are interested, a summary of what learning is covered in each class is now available on each class' webpage.

Passing on Important Messages

We always like to make sure we are out on the playground at the start and end of each day. However, first thing in the morning on the playground can be a tricky place to have an important conversation.

As we don't let parents walk into classrooms without permission (for obvious reasons), if you do want to talk to your child's Teacher, the best thing to do is to leave a message at the office with Mrs Hayton. This way your child's Teacher knows to catch you at the end of the day for a chat.

If the message is more urgent, this can always be passed on through Mrs Hayton also. Alternatively you can always write a short note which your child can pass onto their Teacher when they come in to class.
