Attendance 2015-16...How did we do?

As you know, our attendance dropped quite a bit last year and we have worked hard to improve this again. Well done to all our children and parents for helping us achieve this.

- **For the children in our school in 2015-16 Attendance was: 96.5% (this is *just above* national average)**

Children are expected to attend school for a *minimum* of 90% of the time, through the year. This amounts to less than 3 days absence each half-term.

- **98% of children achieved this - a great achievement**
The number of 'unauthorised absences' also *halved* last year.

More importantly, the children said what was most important to them was to have enough computers so that when a class uses them, every single one of them gets their own, rather than sharing and using some the old, slower laptops we currently have.
