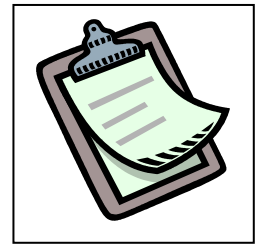

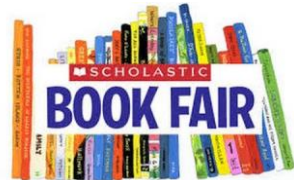

Dropping off children in the morning

A number of parents have recently been dropping off their children in the morning on the playground unsupervised i.e. leaving their child before they have started school. In other cases children have been asked by their parents to come through the school office, again with no adult 'handing them over'. Whereas this has happened once or twice in the past, it is becoming increasingly common.

Whereas with older children there is some common sense needed, sometimes children as young as 5 or 6 are walking into school unsupervised with no parent or carer to be seen (as they are arriving late for school). To our knowledge, the child may have been 'walking the streets', this being the reason for their lateness. It creates a lack of certainty that doesn't sit comfortably with our aim of ensuring all our children are safe.

At the end of each day, we work on the basis that all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will be handed over to a parent or carer when an adult from school has seen that the adult in question is physically present. I feel we need to ensure the same is true in the mornings when parents hand over children to us.
