Nativity - Tickets and Seating

As you are aware, this year we changed how we organise our nativity performances. This year we have used tickets. There are a number of reasons we have done this.

We have grown as a school. Whereas last year we had 87 children, this year we have 107. St Thomas' Church has capacity for 165 people. We have 70 families with children in school – if both parents came this would be 140 adults (even without Grandmas, aunties, uncles etc.). So as you can see, the only safe and fair way to ensure all get to see a performance at a time they can make, it has been necessary this year to allocate places by ticket. We really wanted to avoid people being turned away at the door. If parents turn up without a ticket, you may not literally, be able to fit through the door and would also be embarrassing for all. We are also duty bound to bear health and safety in mind – and simply squeezing extra adults in is not an option. In addition, the children who have speaking parts are located at the back of the church and then walk down the aisles of the church, so again, parents crowding at the back of the church is not possible.

We have put on *two* later performances this year, rather than the afternoon performance we used to. This is to ensure working parents all get a chance to see the performance.

Two tickets per family is how most schools allocate places for their nativity performances. However, from next year we would like to provide the opportunity for parents to bring additional family members. For this reason, staff have agreed that from next year, the nativity will be put on solely by children in Blossom and Willow classes with only parents of children in these classes attending. This will provide parents with the opportunity for 3 years to see their children perform in the Christmas nativity. We are also aware that asking parents of older children to bring their children back to school for an evening performance each year, when they do not have acting parts is a commitment some find hard. Our older children will of course be singing in our annual Carol Concert, which all parents are invited to. Whereas it is nice that all children take part each year, we want to balance this with the 'practicalities' of how this works both for families and school.

All additional tickets have now been allocated will be sent home with your child. We had *just* enough to ensure all requests for additional tickets were met. As stated in previous correspondence, the deadline for getting tickets was today. For this reason, there are now no tickets left for either performance.
