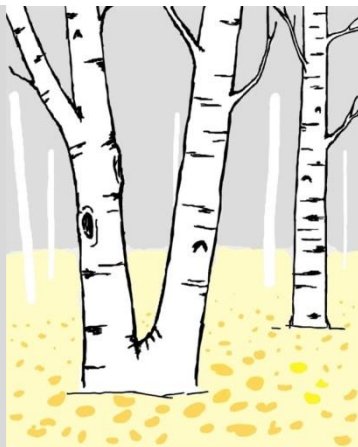


# Birch Class Letter *Summer 2018*



## Home Work

**Spellings** will be given out and tested every Friday. All spellings need to be securely stuck in orange spelling books.

**Maths** - multiplication test every Thursday. Green books for practising multiplication and division facts. These facts are taught in school but regular practice of all times tables at home is essential.

## Reading Books

**Planners** - handed in every *Monday, Wednesday, and Friday* so that books can be changed. Planners should be brought to school every day.

**Target** - to try and read at least 10 minutes each day.
