

**\*\*URGENT – Food in School\*\***

**Does your child eat packed lunches?**

We have three children in school who are allergic to peas and/or nuts, both of which can cause very extreme reactions. Your support of us being a nut-free school when making up lunchboxes would be greatly appreciated by school and the parents concerned.

Please could you also remind your child not to share their food with anyone else as one of our children has a severe egg and milk allergy.

Staff are fully trained to administer emergency medication if this is ever needed. However, as parents yourselves, I am sure you appreciate the concern these allergies can cause the parents of those children affected.



The Christian value we are focussing on this half term is **RESPECT**.



We will be thinking about the importance of treating others with respect even if we sometimes do not agree with the way they behave or the things they say. We will also be thinking about how we should treat the things that belong to us and to other people respectfully. It is also important to respect the built environment as well as the natural world.

### Uniform - a reminder

Please can you ensure that all uniform, coats and PE kits are named? Even writing your child's initials on the clothes label would ensure that, if lost, the item would find its way back to them once again!

Last year there was a very large amount of lost property, which proves very expensive and inconvenient for parents.



Please can you ensure that all hair accessories are appropriate for school – novelty headbands and large bows distract the children (and their friends!) from their learning and can cause upset if they accidentally get broken.

Can I also take this opportunity to remind you that your child should be wearing black school shoes rather than trainers.
