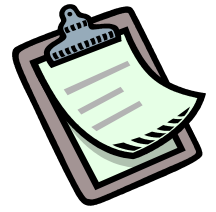

School Uniform

I have written this week to parents of children in year 5. This is to explain how, from September children in year 6 will be permitted to wear a *red* school jumper.

My own and the Governing Body's thinking is that as we have mixed-age classes in our school, we feel that our year 6 children should not miss out on being recognised as our most senior members. More importantly, as a school, we feel strongly that our year 6 children should be regarded as role models for our younger children.

This is something we strongly emphasise in school, and I feel that making a clear distinction between our year 6's and the rest of the school will help the children and staff to support this thinking on a daily basis in school.

Many schools adopt this approach and Headteacher colleagues tell me they feel it works really well, in building up the responsibility, self-esteem and maturity of our oldest children.



It feels like we have finally entered the digital-age at Sutton CE this week. Class trips, swimming lessons and school dinners can now be paid for online. You will have received a letter this week detailing how you can set up a 'Parent Pay' account with school. If you are unsure how to do this, see Mrs Hayton in the school office, who will be happy to help.

We are currently planning to introduce this payment system for Bobbins before and after school club also, and will let you know when this is up and running.

New faces at St Thomas'

Pupil Wellbeing

I include below some responses from our children on their feelings around how safe they feel in school. The percentages in brackets are averages for all North Yorkshire School. Although this is an area that we will always endeavour to do more on in school, I feel our own children's feelings on these matters compare very favourably to other North Yorkshire schools

- **64%** (48%) of pupils responded that they 'always' feel happy during school playtimes.
- **72%** (72%) of pupils responded that they 'always' feel safe during school playtimes.
- **41%** (65%) of pupils responded that they have experienced negative behaviours at least a 'few times' in the last month, while **4%** (7%) experienced such behaviour 'every day'.
- **11%** (35%) of pupils responded that they have been pushed/hit for no reason at least a 'few times' in the last month, while **4%** (18%) said they have had belongings taken/broken.
- **26%** (36%) of pupils responded that they have experienced negative behaviour outside at school during break times in the last month, while **11%** (24%) have experienced such behaviour in a classroom during break times and **11%** (21%) have experienced it at or near home.
- **12%** (22%) of pupils responded that they have been bullied at or near school in the last 12 months.
