


'Learning for Life'

It has been a really busy few weeks for school, there has been lots of exciting and fun learning taking place, where children have been fully engaged and actively participating in.

In Blossom the children have been working hard on journey stories and are challenging themselves to make their sentences better by adding adjectives. Beau told me, "They are describing words." The children are really putting all their effort into their handwriting and I was astounded by how many children are really trying to join their letters.

The children in Willow class have become explorers just like Christopher Columba. They have been writing reports about Christopher and his journey to America on the ship called the Pinta. They are now challenging themselves to write a letter in the first person as if they were Christopher. We look forward to reading the letters.

In Birch multiplication and division have been the order of the day where they children have persevered with understanding the more formal method of column multiplication whilst still demonstrating their mathematical understanding using equipment and resources. The children have also been using their own cuddly teddies and toys to really think about the different reactions in a narrative. They used the teddies to really 'feel' the story.


Oak class have been challenging themselves this week with adding fractions – a tricky thing to do when some of your fractions are improper or mixed numbers. The children have worked hard on using different ways to represent the mathematical concepts involved (equivalence, simplification, addition, multiples, factors, lowest common) I was extremely proud of the level of detail that the children have put into their art work over the last couple of weeks, through water colour of winter tress to designing their own totem poles.
