The summer term is when we start thinking about class organisation for next year. If you do have any concerns about which class your child will be in, please do come and talk to us.




### **Tag Rugby**

#### **Transport Consultation**

North Yorkshire County Council has a statutory responsibility to provide travel assistance between home and school for eligible children. They transport around 20,000 pupils every day; the total cost of transport in 2017/18 was £22.6 million. NYCC are now consulting on the discretionary help they provide above and beyond the statutory requirements.

NYCC have started to implement the proposals agreed last year as part of the SEND Transport Consultation, and through that process a number of other suggestions were provided by the public for the authority to consider. The changes they are consulting on will help the council to make long-term savings and bring the home to school transport service in line with Department for Education statutory guidelines, to ensure the local authority is allocated the correct funding from central government.
