#### **Before and End of School Procedure**

A quick reminder of the key points:

- Parents are responsible for their children before the school bell rings in the morning; please can you ensure that wherever you are stood you have a clear view of your child. Children who walk to school on their own should not arrive before the bell rings at 8:50am.
- Please can we remind all parents that you should leave site as soon as you have collected your children after school and that you do not allow them to play on site at this point as they are no longer insured.
- At pick up, please continue to keep the area around the doors free so that we can see all children to the person who is collecting them.

#### **Cancellation of Bobbins sessions**

Can we please remind parents that <u>a</u> <u>minimum of 24 hours notice</u> is required to cancel any individual sessions. If less than 24 hours notice is given then parents will be charged for these sessions unless there are exceptional circumstances.
